Gerard “Jerry” Greene, a Gold Legacy Life Member of the John Franklin Sprague VFW Post 6796 in Dallas, Texas, was elected in June 2021 as State Surgeon at the 101st Department of Texas VFW State Convention held in Durant, Oklahoma.

A VFW member since 2002, Comrade Greene served as District 3 Commander (2015-2016) and District 3 Chief of Staff (2018-2019) and as District 3 Trustee. He served as VFW Post 6796 Commander in 2012-2014 and 2018-2021. He earned honors as an All-State District 3 Commander in 2015-2016. He served as State Deputy Chief of Staff (2017-2018).

Comrade Greene was appointed as National Deputy Chief of Staff (2017-2018) and National Aide-de-Camp (2015-2016). He was appointed to the National Veterans and Military Support Committee (2019-2021). He also serves as a Veterans Affairs Voluntary Service (VAVS) Deputy Representative in the VA North Texas Healthcare System in Dallas. He was awarded the National Surgeon Award for 2020-2021 by Renee L. Simpson, VFW National Surgeon General.

Comrade Greene served in the United States Army from 1968 to 1971 earning his VFW eligibility serving in Vietnam. He earned the Silver Star, Army Commendation Medal with V Device, Vietnam Campaign Medal with 3 Bronze Service Stars, Vietnam Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal, Combat Infantry Badge and Paratrooper Wings.

Born in Paris, France, Comrade Greene immigrated to the United States in 1960 and lived in Biloxi, Mississippi. After leaving the military in 1972, Comrade Greene went back to school in the electronics technology field. After 11 years working for two different companies in the same field, he started his own engineering firm in the Electro-Mechanical field. He retired in 2002 and lives in Dallas with his wife, Pam.
